The DAHSAA Scholarship Committee (of 6) is proud to announce the 5 recipients of the \$1000 scholarships, which DAHSAA awards to Dover's graduating seniors, each year.

To date, we have awarded 50 scholarships (over \$40,000) in the past 11 years. This year, we had 16 wonderful student applicants. Applicants are judged in the following areas: Grades/Academics, Work Experience, Community Service, Honors and Awards, Leadership, Extracurricular Activities and Essay; we also consider Financial Need. All scores are entered into an Excel Spreadsheet, with the top 5 applicants coming to the top for 2022.

Each recipient of the DAHSAA Scholarship received \$1000 at the Annual DAHSAA Membership Picnic, in May. Checks were presented by Scholarship chair, Shelly Livingston.

Also, Jeff Fenstermacher attended the Dover Area H.S. Awards Banquet where he introduced all 5 recipients.

<u>Featured Dover Alum</u> Amy (Myers) Trinca's Story

As I entered retirement on August 1st, it caused me to reflect on the path my life has taken. After graduating from Dover in 1974 I attended Virginia Commonwealth University where I majored in Recreation Therapy. As a young child, I experienced a kidney

disease that required me to use a wheelchair for a brief time. From this experience, I developed a passion for working with folks who had experienced spinal cord, stroke. or traumatic brain injury. Recreation Therapy is all about helping folks who have been injured find leisure activities they can enjoy or relearn how to participate in hobbies they may have had prior to injury. From my experience as a young child, I knew what it was like to not be able to participate with others because I was in a wheelchair. I found great iov in helping others be able to participate in life again, through adaptive skiing, swimming, basketball, art, archery, and so much more!

I began my career in 1978 at Woodrow Wilson Rehabilitation Center in Virginia, where I primarily worked through my 40 years in the Rec. Therapy field. I also worked with folks experiencing mental health concerns for about 15 years, helping them to find enjoyment in their life when they were experiencing mental health crisis. I have found so much fulfillment in my job! Looking back, it is humbling to realize I have helped thousands of people find meaning and excitement in their life after challenges.

Some of my personal "speed bumps" have been difficult to overcome but have helped me to relate to individuals I have worked closely with during my time as a professional. I have experienced health issues, career changes, and two marriages ending. My first marriage ended in divorce and my second marriage ended with the death of my husband who experienced mental health issues that contributed to his death. After my second husband's death, I had a hard time overcoming both feelings of depression and sadness. While it was difficult to pull myself up from the bottom, I know it has helped me to help others because I can relate to what they are experiencing.

I purchased a small farm in 1999, with the intention of having a few horses and cows. Following the death of my second husband and my daughters starting their adult lives, it took on a much greater meaning. It has been wonderful for my daughters to bring their children to the farm and engage with my animals during their visits. The farm is now primarily made up of rescue animals! Over the years, we have had various animals such as sheep, goats, llamas, alpacas, cows, ducks, chickens, horses, donkeys, and rabbits. Taking care of these animals is very therapeutic for me and I have shared the farm over the years with various community groups, such as Girl Scout Troops, children with severe illnesses, and adults with special needs. I also have had many dogs over the years they have all been female Golden Retrievers who bring so much life to the farmhouse.

The plan for retirement? Spend each day at my farm, caring for my animals. I anticipate having many visitors come to the farm to visit, as I very much enjoy hosting folks at my little farm. Additionally, I have been certified as a Chaplain through my church and plan to be a resource for folks in my community who are experiencing their own "speed bumps." I am so thankful for my friendships from Kralltown and Dover for their love and support over the years. Dover not only gave me a diploma in 1974, but it also gave me friends that have made my life so rich. Just remember - my farm is always open for visitors. As Gina Decker (class of 1974) calls it: "Amie's Bed and Breakfast!"
