


DAHSAA 2023 Scholarship Recipients — Shelly Livingston, Scholarship Chairperson

The DAHSAA Scholarship Committee (of 7) is proud to announce the five recipients of the \$1,000 scholarships, which DAHSAA awards to Dover's graduating seniors, each year. To date, we have awarded fifty-five scholarships (over \$45,000) in the past 12 years. This year, we had eighteen wonderful student applicants. It is always a rewarding task for the Scholarship Committee to read about all these intelligent and resolute students. We want to thank all the applicants for their work while at Dover H.S. and in the community, a wonderful group of senior students. Applicants are judged in the following areas: Grades/Academics, Work Experience, Community Service, Honors and Awards, Leadership, Extracurricular Activities and Essay; also considered was Financial Need. The judges enter the scores into a Spreadsheet, with the top five applicants coming to the top for 2023.

Each recipient of the DAHSAA Scholarship received a check to be used for whatever is needed for their post high school education. The recipients were announced at the annual DAHSAA Membership Picnic, in May. Also, Jeff Fenstermacher attended the Dover Area H.S. Edward Spangler Thank you, Ed, for sharing your interesting story!

I am a 1973 graduate of Dover High School. I grew up in the area and had the great pleasure of growing up around a wonderful group of similar friends from elementary school through high school.

Hello, graduating class of 73. We just had our 50th class reunion!



At the end of high school, I had no real career aspiration or direction. I only knew that I needed to go to college somewhere. I had one meeting with our high school guidance counselor. He suggested my grades weren't good enough to get into a good school so perhaps I should apply to Penn State! I did and had the pleasure of attending Penn State. What a wonderful experience! It opened so many doors in my life from great academic training to diverse groups of people to lifelong friends. A campus that size was a great melting pot of so many kinds of people and experiences that I had never been exposed to before. In addition to the academic training, it really set a course for the great diversity of people and convictions within the world and how to operate in it. I graduated in 1977 with a degree in political science and economics. Even with this training I still didn't know what career direction to pursue.

I got my first job with a nonprofit in Atlanta. This was another great experience. Moving to a large city and beginning to travel the country. But I knew that nonprofit work was not for me, so I considered applying to graduate MBA programs. This was in 1982 and Penn State had just won its first national championship in football. So, I only applied to Penn State and returned to finish in 1985 with an MBA with concentrations in marketing and finance.

After graduation I was recruited by a consulting firm in Chicago. This began a 31-year career in the consulting industry. In my last 20 years, I had two global roles and several US roles. I had the great pleasure of traveling the country and the world. I also had the pleasure of working with mostly Fortune 100 sized companies to solve some of their most complex issues impeding their growth and profitability.

I retired in 2016 and served as a Board Advisor to a global consulting firm. I am now completely and thankfully retired living a slower, awesome life.

I've been married to a fellow Pennsylvanian (Glenda, pictured above) for 34 years and counting.

Mine is a story I've shared with countless kids and young professionals. You don't necessarily need to know what you want to be. Begin the journey, do your best to learn and excel and enjoy the ride.
